CHEESE

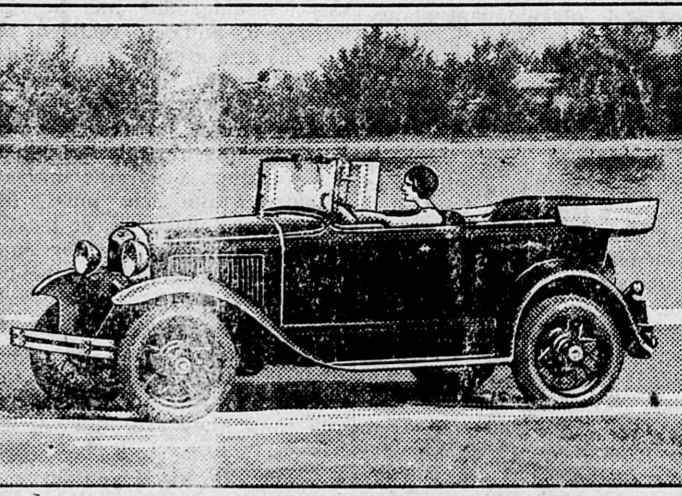
